Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we gather this month, we celebrate Valentine's Day. This is a day when we remember St. Valentine and give thanks for what he did in marrying young Christian men and women during times of persecution. It is a day to celebrate love, both of husbands and wives, as well as every Christian's love toward Christ for His saving Death and Resurrection from the dead. How do you know that someone loves you? You know it, not only by the words they say, but also by how they act.

St. Paul writes in Ephesians that Husbands and Wives show their love for each other by fulfilling certain roles and responsibilities in love towards each other. They do this, not always perfectly (after all just ask the other about all of their faults!), but they do so reflecting Christ's love for one another. For Husbands, it is love their wives the same as Christ loves the Church. How much does he love the Church? Enough to give His very life so that she may be made spotless and clean through the shedding of His blood. Husbands are the head, when the chips fall, they are the ones who bear the responsibility. Now, does this mean that everything they say must be obeyed one hundred percent or else? No, they are the head and they use that headship to love and serve their wives. For example, when it comes time to buy a new car, what do they buy? That new Harley that they have had their eye on, or a new minivan to support their growing family? More than likely that minivan as that is what is best for their family and in love they postpone that Harley for a time.

Wives show their love by submitting to their husbands. This does not mean that they are a doormat and have no say. Rather, the opposite, they have a lot of say when it comes to making decisions, just not the final say always. For example, let's say they are at the supermarket. Do they have to call their husbands about every loaf of bread they have so that they pick the right one? No, they have bread on the list and they know that their husband has put money in the bank so in that security, they go and buy bread. They might even get an extra loaf of the kind he likes to show their love for him. In love, both serve and submit to the other, always looking out not for their own interests but for the best interests of their spouse.

The same can be applied to the Church. Men are the heads as Christ is the head. Does this mean that women can do nothing but be quiet and silent? No, just look at the LWML and Altar Guild for ways that women can serve and support the Church. Look at the acolytes and ushers as ways that even the youth can serve in the church. There are lots of things that everyone can do to support the church, each in their own ways, always in love for the others, reflecting back the love of Christ Jesus our Lord, and always within the limits that God has established them.

As we serve each other in love, may we always live in the grace, mercy, forgiveness, and love of Christ
