Have you ever seen the movie the Lion King? In it, Scar the main villain, has a song that can help us this Advent season. The song is titled Be Prepared. In the song, preparation is mandatory for things that are completely and totally unexpected. We have to be prepared for the unexpected. As Christians, we have to be prepared, not for the unexpected, but for the expected Return of our Lord.

Advent is all about preparing for our Lord's coming. Many people think that it is about getting ready for Christmas. In a way, they are partially correct. As we prepare for our Lord's birth we are being prepared for our Lord's second coming. We remember why our Lord took on our flesh, to do what we could never do. God takes on our flesh, enters into His creation in order to save us from our sins by shedding His precious blood upon the Cross. This is not old news. It was foretold by many of the Old Testament prophets, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Zechariah, and Malachi to name a few. Our Lord has kept His promises and will continue to do so.

That is why we have to be prepared, we have to be ready. Our Lord keeps every single one of His promises, which means that He is returning, as He promised His disciples. We do not know the day or the hour when we will face our own judgements in death, nor do we know when our Lord is returning in glory. All we know is that He has promised and He will fulfill it, therefore we must be prepared.

How are we prepared? Our Lord prepares us every time we gather around His good gifts of Word and Sacrament. Baptizing us into His death and resurrection, our Lord prepares us for the end by giving us life everlasting. Feasting on our Lord's true body and blood, we are assured of the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation. Hearing the blessed words of Absolution, "Your sins are forgiven." Our consciouses are at peace, reconciled to God by the blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Are you ready? Are you prepared? Thanks be to God that He prepares us to celebrate the Nativity of our Lord and prepares our hearts and minds by His coming to be ready for His second coming!
