"After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem saying, "Where is He who has been born King of the Jews? For we have seen His star in the East and have come to worship Him." Matthew 2:1-2

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Have you ever looked up at the stars on a clear moonlit night? It is a favorite activity of both kids and adults, staring in awestruck wonder at the glimmers of light and trying to make out the constellations. People have done this for many years, going as far back as 3,000 years ago. As we celebrate the season of Epiphany this month, we continue the age-old tradition of looking at stars.

According to Matthew, Wise men, often referred to as Magi come to King Herod because they "saw his star in the east and have come to worship him." They were looking at the stars and saw this special one that heralded the birth of a new king. They packed their bags, their gifts of frankincense, gold, and myrrh, and followed the star. When it disappeared, they go to Jerusalem, figuring that that is where the king is to be born as that is where the king lives. Herod tells them that there is no new king and consults the scribes who state that they need to go to Bethlehem.

So they go to Bethlehem, rejoicing when the star reappears. The star leads them to the house, where they find Mary, Joseph, and the young Jesus. They bow and worship Him as the King, all because they followed a star.

We too follow this Epiphany season, yet we follow not a star but the very One who made the stars. Having followed the wisemen to the house, we continue to follow our Lord as He is revealed as the One who is the Light of the World. Ultimately, we follow Him to Calvary, there to see Him suffer, bleed, and die so that we could be reconciled to God and made His holy people. We follow the women and disciples to the empty tomb. There we see the empty grave cloths as proof of His resurrection, thus giving to us everlasting life. We follow to the Mount of Olives, seeing our Lord ascent to the very heights of heaven to prepare a place for us. We hear the promise that He will return again, as we confess in the creeds to judge the living and the dead.

Dear Christian, as we begin a new year, may we always continue following, not a star, but the very One who made the stars, our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who became flesh and blood, died, and rose from the dead for you and me.
