Colossians 1:13-14

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

What is Independence? Having independence means that we are no longer under someone's control. Especially this month, we celebrate our country's independence from Great Britian on July 4, 1776. It means that America is no longer under the control of Great Britian. America is free to make its own decisions. This is certainly a blessing that God has granted to us. He has given us the freedom to vote for our elected officials and those who represent us. As Americans, we like to celebrate our independence and freedom that we have.

Yet, there is something even more important that we can celebrate. Our freedom, not from a political tyranny, but from a spiritual one. All of us were in the domain of darkness, as St. Paul writes, we were under the control and tyranny of Satan. Under Satan's control, we sin, day in and day out. Even worse, we do not care who we hurt or how grievously we offend God or break His laws. Complete and utter depravity from which we were powerless to save ourselves, if we even desired to save ourselves in the first place!

Thus, why God, in His great love for us, did for us what we could never do. He sent Jesus. Jesus lays aside His glory and power, takes on our humanity, lives a perfect life, and goes to the cross. Why? To bear the full wrath of God over every single one of our sins. He who knew no sin, becomes sin for us. He who is Light of Light begotten, bears the full and horrible weight of our darkness. Why? To give us His life and light forever. Jesus binds up the strong man, and plunders his house. He crushes Satan's head and frees us. Frees us from the tyranny of Satan, death, and hell by His death and resurrection from the dead. Through His Word and Sacraments, Jesus takes us out of the domain of darkness into His marvelous light.

We have been set free. Free, not to just do whatever our sinful nature wants, but freed to live as the people of God. In Christ Jesus, we have been freed, freed from the tyranny of Satan, death, and the power of hell. We are free to live as children of God to the praise of His holy name. Rather than seeing God's laws as tyranny, we rejoice in them because the Law shows us our sins in preparation for the Gospel, that Christ has kept the Law perfectly on our behalf. The Law also acts as a guide. It shows us how we are to live as Christians. As we sing, "The Law of God is good and wise."

As we celebrate our nation's independent this month, let us rejoice even more in the independence won for us by Christ Jesus, our Lord upon the cross of Calvary and the eternal life and freedom that He graces us with.
