Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Trust. It is something that all of us seek as social creatures. It is the cornerstone of any relationship. If someone's trust is broken by an affair, gossip, lying, or anything else, it takes many years, if not lifetimes, to regain. If I tell you something in confidence. We trust in the government, ourselves, our own power and authority, our wealth, our reputation, and much more. Anything, rather than trusting in the Lord. We are deserving of destruction.

The Lord though, promises salvation at the end of this chapter. He is rich in grace and mercy. He promises that He will protect, defend, and pass over Jerusalem for its salvation and deliverance. Passing over reminds us of the first Passover when the Lord passed over the blood-stained houses to redeem His people from Egyptian slavery. It also points to the deliverance that you and I have because of Jesus Christ. His blood was shed to give us the forgiveness of our sins and the salvation of our souls.

As we go through our earthly lives, let us always trust, not in worldly things, but in the power, grace, and mercy of our God.
