### **Follow Jesus**

In the children's game "Follow the Leader", the premise of the game is quite simple. Followers are to watch the leader and do everything the leader does, say everything the leader says, and go wherever the leader goes. If the leader stands up and you sit down, you are not following the leader. If the leader says "purple" and you say "orange", you're not following the leader. If the leader goes 100 feet to the north and you go 100 feet to the south, you're not following the leader. It doesn't matter if you tell the leader that you know the game very well, that you really like the game very much, that you did these different things because you felt they were better things to do than what the leader had done, or that you belong to a club that plays the game all the time. It's really quite simple: if you are not following the leader then you cannot win the game called "Follow the Leader".

Since the time of the apostles, Jesus has called people, including you and me, to follow Him. Following Jesus is much like the children's game: you do whatever Jesus does; you go wherever Jesus goes; and you say whatever Jesus says. The specifics of this are quite basic and Jesus explains them by saying, "If anyone would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross and follow me." (Matthew 17:24)

The amazing thing is that people want to follow Jesus, but not go where Jesus goes, do what Jesus does, or say what Jesus says. Who wants to deny their wants and desires? We want to indulge ourselves so that we not only have the basics of life but more and more luxuries. Taking up the cross means accepting suffering, pain, rejection, and perhaps much worse in the service of Christ. Who wants to do that? We wish to avoid suffering at all costs. We want people to like us, not reject us. We don't want to go where Jesus went. Jesus' journey took him to a cross. In short, we don't want to follow our leader and do what He does, go where He goes, or say what He says.

Yet, many in American Christianity who do not deny themselves, who are not taking up their crosses, and who have not gone the way that Jesus went, still think they are following Jesus because they were confirmed and know the Christian faith, because they have joined the Christian congregation, because they think they know better than God what constitutes Christian behavior.

There are real consequences for not following Jesus and it has nothing to do with winning a game. It is much more serious than that. It all has to do with your eternal destiny. Where will you end up? If you do not follow Jesus, then you will not arrive at the same place Jesus has arrived at, namely, heaven.

To follow Jesus means you need to be where Jesus is and can be found. Jesus has promised to be in His Word. Therefore, to be able to follow Jesus is to be in His Word – hearing it in Divine Service and reading it in your home. To actually follow Jesus is to turn your back on the culture of indulging and avoiding suffering and to go where Jesus is leading. Is it tough? You better believe it! It's much easier not to follow Jesus. In fact, Jesus says, "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few." (Matthew 7:13-14)

The theme for our Wednesday evening Lent services is, "Follow Jesus!" Take time during the next six weeks to meditate upon what it means to follow Jesus and how to become empowered through His Word to actually follow Him. A simple soup supper will be served at 6 PM and worship begins at 7 PM. Come, let us follow Jesus together.


