Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

How is your Lent fast going? Many people give up something for the season of Lent. Some people give up chocolate, soda, coffee, Facebook, Television, or a wide variety of other things. They wish to fast similar to how our Lord fasted for forty days and nights. They do this, in order to follow the words of Saint Peter, "To supplement their faith." To enhance their faith and knowledge with self-control. In order to depend, not upon the things of this world, but to focus their minds and hearts upon God.

This can be very hard to do! Giving up something that you do or eat on a daily or semidaily basis is hard and difficult, both the start and end. It takes self-control and steadfastness to abstain from something for a prolonged period of time. We may at times see it as a trial and suffering, but it can be a good thing in the end.

This is a microcosm of what we are called to do as Christians. We are called to give up, not small things like Facebook or soda, but big things. We are called, as Christians, to give up sinning, to resist the temptations of the Devil. We are called to live in all godliness with brotherly affection and love.

This is not something that we can do on our own, under our own strength and power. It can be done only in and through Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. He has paid the price of all of our sins by taking them upon Himself and living a perfect life in our place. He has taken all of our sins and nailed them to the cross, suffering, bleeding, and dying for us. Rising again from the dead, He gives to us new life. He makes it possible for us that we can have self-control, not give in to evil desires, to live lives of self-control, to love each other with love and brotherly affection.

As we continue our Lenten fasts, whatever they may be, let us indeed hold fast, that we may grow together as Brothers and Sisters in Christ, thought Jesus Christ our Lord.

Most Christians are aware that Jesus is the King of kings, but there is much to be explored in this aspect of Christology. The Books of Chronicles are focused on the kingdom of Judah, which is to say the House of David. Interpreters often miss that the goal of Chronicles is to illustrate, through the kings of Judah, the rule of the coming King—the Christ, who will sit on the throne of his father David forever. The goal of these sermons is to bring the kingdom of Christ into clearer focus through the lens of the good kings (mostly) of Judah as they are portrayed in the Chronicles. From this point of view, the focus is not on how we should learn righteousness from the kings of Judah, but on how each king is a shadow of the one true King, Jesus Christ. He is the fulfillment of the promise, which each king was unable to realize.
