"Come now, let us reason together, says the Lord: though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall become like wool. Isaiah 1:18

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

They say that April showers bring May flowers, I am not sure what a snow shower in February will bring this month!

Yet it does remind me, as we continue this season of Lent, of what we have to look forward to at the end of Lent. Lent culminates in the greatest Feast of the Christian Calander: Easter, the day we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

During this season we reflect upon why Jesus took on our flesh, why He became one of us. Why? Because of our great and many sins against God and other people. All of us are stained by sin. As Isaiah writes, they are like scarlet, red like crimson. We are stained fully and completely, in our thoughts, as we ponder inwardly the choice words that we would love to yell at the person who just rear ended us, or the child who is being defiant against our wishes. The very words that pour out of our mouths show the blood red corruption that we have, both those spoken in frustration, anger, rebellion, deception, and those known only to us. Even our deeds are filthy. We do nothing good, doing everything for our own self-gratification, no matter who it might hurt in the process. A stain, a blemish that, try as hard we can to remove it, we cannot.

How can our blemish be removed? Because of Jesus. He takes upon Himself our sins. He who knew no sin became sin for us. Upon the Cross, He bears the punishment of our sins, bearing the full wrath of God on our behalf. Because of Jesus' death and resurrection, our stained scarlet selves are made white as snow! Because of Jesus, we are fully and completely forgiven of every single one of our sins.

We are cleansed and given new life. We are justified by the work of Christ. He sends us the Holy Spirit, given to us through the waters of Holy Baptism. The Holy Spirit does His work and we are sanctified. Our thoughts, words, and deeds are turned, not inward to ourselves but outward to the needs and desires of our neighbors. In meeting their needs, we are living the holy lives that God has called us to. May we continue to do so until the day He calls us to His nearer presence and our blemished self is put to death forever.
