Godbwye

In proofing this article for publication in the church's newsletter, the church secretary has probably concluded that my dictation software for my computer is malfunctioning again and that she has to correct the spelling. Although the program has been a great help for me since my typing skills have diminished, it can occasionally come up with some very strange words that have never existed before. One might think the title of this devotion is such a word.

But it's not. "Godbwye" is actually the old English spelling of a word which I don't want to use now and you don't want to hear. It is a word which often conveys sadness and separation. It is a word which can bring forth tears. It is a word which we try to avoid saying and which we try to avoid hearing when it is said to us. The word is "goodbye."

I have served as your pastor for fourteen years and now it is time for me to leave. Saying goodbye is difficult. We have heard the Word of God together, knelt to receive the body and blood of our Savior Jesus Christ together, prayed together, and sang our praises together. We had been through a lot together. We have shared the joy of baptisms, confirmations, and weddings. We have shared the grief of hospitalizations, death beds, and funerals. I have visited you, prayed with you, and been with you during important times in your lives. In turn, you have been loving and supportive of my family and me. You have encouraged me when I've done well and have been patient and forgiving with me when I didn't.

That's what makes saying goodbye so difficult. The word emphasizes the ending of a relationship due to physical separation. There is the feeling of finality in this new arrangement.

But that's only if you use the word in its present form. "Goodbye" is actually an old English contraction of the phrase, "God be with you." The emphasis of the phrase is not from whom you are separated but with whom you remain joined. In sending out His disciples to go all over the world with the Gospel, Jesus reminds them, "And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." (Matthew 28:20) Our Lord is with us, as He was with them, when he scatters us to the ends of the earth (even Indiana).

That's not all. Our baptisms not only unite us with Jesus Christ, but with one another. The Word of God says, "For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Galatians 3:27-28) To be "in Christ" means we are always united with Christ and always united with one another. Distance does not change that. Death does not prevent that. We remain with each other, even when physically separated or dead.

Having said all of that and believed all of that, it still will be very emotional and very difficult for my family and I to leave Great Falls. However, the joy and the hope that we have means that it doesn't have to remain emotional and difficult. We rejoice that we remain with Christ always. We find comfort that "in Christ" we remain always with one another in the "holy Christian church; the communion of saints." And we look forward eagerly to the time when our presence together will be like it is now, either here on earth or hereafter in heaven.
